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What sort of test is the JLPT?

- The test evaluates and certifies Japaneselanguage proficiency of non-native speakers.
- It has over 30 years of history since its establishment in 1984.
- The test has been jointly conducted by the Japan Foundation (JF) and Japan Educational Exchanges and Services (JEES).
- The test in Hong Kong is co-organized by Society of Japanese Language Education Hong Kong (香港日本語教育研究會) and the JF.

1. Measures communicative competence required to perform tasks

Japanese-language proficiency that the JLPT measures

- 1 Knowledge of the Japanese language:
 - How much a test taker knows about the Japanese language, including vocabulary and grammar
- 2 Ability to use the knowledge of 1
 - How well a test taker makes use of language knowledge in actual communication

Measured through 3 test sections

	The abil	ity to understand Japanese used in a variety of circumstances.
N1	Redding	 One is able to read writings with logical complexity and/or abstract writings on a variety of topics, such as newspaper editorials and critiques, and comprehend both their structures and contents. One is also able to read written materials with profound contents on various topics and follow their narratives as well as understand the intent of the writers comprehensively.
	Listening	One is able to comprehend orally presented materials such as coherent conversations, news reports, and lectures, spoken at natural speed in a broad variety of settings, and is able to follow their ideas and comprehend their contents comprehensively. One is also able to understand the details of the presented materials such as the relationships among the people involved, the logical structures, and the essential points.
		ility to understand Japanese used in everyday situations, and in a variety of tances to a certain degree.
N2	Reading	 One is able to read materials written clearly on a variety of topics, such as articles and commentaries in newspapers and magazines as well as simple critiques, and comprehend their contents. One is also able to read written materials on general topics and follow their narratives as well as understand the intent of the writers.
	Listening	 One is able to comprehend orally presented materials such as coherent conversations and news reports, spoken at nearly natural speed in everyday situations as well as in a variety of settings, and is able to follow their ideas and comprehend their contents. Summary of Linguistic Competence Required for N3 Level

The ability to understand Japanese used in everyday situations to a certain degree. One is able to read and understand written materials with specific contents concerning everyday topics. One is also able to grasp summary information such as newspaper headlines.

- In addition, one is also able to read slightly difficult writings encountered in everyday situations and understand the main points of the content if some alternative phrases are available to aid one's understanding.

- · One is able to listen and comprehend coherent conversations in everyday situations, spoken at near natural speed, and is generally able to follow their contents as well as grasp the relationships among the people involved.



N4	·One is able to read and understand passages on familiar daily topics written in basic vocabulary and <i>kanji</i> .							
	· One is able to listen and comprehend conversations encountered in daily life and generally follow their contents, provided that they are spoken slowly.							
	The ability to understand some basic Japanese.							
N5	·One is able to read and understand typical expressions and sentences written in hiragana, katakana, and basic kanji.							
	 One is able to listen and comprehend conversations about topics regularly encountered in daily life and classroom situations, and is able to pick up necessary information from short conversations spoken slowly. 							

Level	Corresponding Levels of the current (2010~) and the former (1984~2009) tests
N1	Approximately the same level as the former Level 1 test, but designed to measure slightly more advanced abilities
N2	Approximately the same level as the former Level 2 test
N3	Positioned at a level bridging the former Level 2 and Level 3 tests Newly established
N4	Approximately the same level as the former Level 3 test
N5	Approximately the same level as the former Level 4 test

3. More accurately measures Japanese-language proficiency with scaled score.

JLPT uses Scaled scores \Leftrightarrow Raw scores

- The same competency is given the same number of points in each test
- The same scale is always used to calculate scores for the same-level test



- * The highest degree of fairness can be maintained, as scaled scores never fluctuate based on the difficulty level of tests
- * Scaled scores can indicate an applicant's proficiency more accurately than raw scores do

Example: A-san's test results in raw scores and scaled scores



A-san took N2 level tests in July as well as in December. Below are his Listening test results.


The list can be used by test takers and others as a reference to get an idea of "what successful test takers of a particular level can do in Japanese."

Sample

Listening	I can understand the general content when I hear announcements at school, work or public places.
Speaking	I can speak in detail of my hopes and experience at interviews such as for a job or part-time work.
Reading	I can understand the content of newspaper or magazine articles about topics I am interested in.
Writing	I can write letters or emails to express my emotions such as appreciation or apology.

Application periods

•July JLPT:
Mid-March~ Early-April

• December JLPT: Mid-August ~ Early-September



Test Fee

HK\$ 700 (as of July 2022)

- Test fee once paid for a specific level is not refundable or transferrable nor can it be used for application for change of test level.
- No subsequent request for change of test venue or test level will be entertained.

Payment

- Payment must be settled by exact amount before deadline (based on transaction time).
- Failure to do so will be treated as invalid payment and refund process will take approximately two months.



Special Circumstances

The Japanese Language Proficiency Test is conducted in various parts of the world on the same day, no supplementary test would be offered.



Special Circumstances

Under exceptional circumstances, such as typhoon signal, black rainstorm warning, act of nature, civil commotion... etc., the test will be cancelled.

In such cases, candidates may opt to sit for the next test without re-application or request a refund of 50% of test fee paid. SOJLEHK will not be liable for any claim for loss due to such cancellation.
